

Guide to Submitting Successful Photos

ANGLES: 1,2,3 and 4 are the front and rear three-quarter of both driver and passenger sides. 5 is the front, 6 is the rear, 7 the engine, 8 the interior and 9 will be the trunk.

ABOUT THE CAR: For exterior shots, be sure to have the hood and trunk down, doors and windows closed. Do not cut off the nose or tail end of your vehicle.


LIGHTING: Feature your vehicle in good lighting (preferably outdoors), with good color, and very little shadows and glare.

BACKGROUND: Feature your vehicle with a plain background such as a field, country road, garage, house, brick wall, parking lot, etc. Do not include people, pets, signs, other vehicles, or any other objects. Also, be wary of questionable objects in the background.

PHOTO QUALITY: We prefer you use a digital camera with at least 8 megapixel or higher resolution. Modern smart phones may be used as a last resort but only if they have a sufficient resolution of 8 megapixels or higher.

If you have Adobe Photoshop, you can check the photo size. Go to the image menu and choose Image size. In the Image size window, be sure Resample Image is UNchecked, type 300 in the box beside the word Resolution. Beside width and height, use the pull-down menus to choose inches. If the measurements are no smaller than 2 inches high and 3 inches wide, your digital photograph will be acceptable.

Quick Guide for Perfect 1st Photo



For angle, stand about **15 feet away** from the vehicle, **zoom in** until you see what's on the left and hold the camera at the **same height as the roof** of the vehicle as illustrated here:
